RULES & REGULATIONS FOR THE CONDUCT OF THE SHOW

INDUSTRIAL AND HOME INDUSTRIES SECTION

1. All work in the Industrial and Home Industries Section must be the bona-fide work of the Exhibitor. Sewing and knitting must be shown unwashed and must have been completed at a date later than the last preceding Show.
2. Jams and Jellies to be shown in glass jars.
3. All scones to be baked prior to day of Show.
4. All exhibits entered in the Home Industries Section must have been made by the Exhibitor or under his or her management.
5. All Staging Cards or Labels must be securely fixed to the exhibits.
6. No one except those officially retained will be allowed in the marquees during judging.
7. All Exhibits (Home Industries) to be staged by 9.30 a.m. on the day of the Show. Marquees will be open for staging from 8 a.m. They may not be removed before 4.00 p.m. AND ONLY ON PRODUCTION OF THEIR REMOVAL CARDS.
8. All Classes will be Open unless otherwise stated.
9. All Exhibits are at Exhibitor's own risk and although every possible care will be taken, the Committee will not be responsible for any loss of, or damage to, Exhibits.
10. Exhibits in the Gift Classes and other Exhibits specially gifted by Exhibitors will be auctioned after the Show for the benefit of the Society's funds. Staging Cards, where used, should be marked accordingly.
11. Should any infringement of the Rules take place, any prize won by the Exhibitor concerned will be forfeited.
12. In no case shall a prize be awarded unless the Judges deem the Exhibit of sufficient merit. Where three or less than three Exhibits are presented in any class, prizes may be awarded at the Judges' discretion.
13. Any protests or objections must be in writing and in the hands of the Secretary not later than 3 p.m. on the day of the Show, together with a deposit of £5.00. The parties concerned must furnish all evidence and information required by the Executive Committee, whose decision is final. The deposit shall be returned to the objector unless the Executive Committee consider the protest or objection to be frivolous, in which case it shall be forfeited. If the protest or objection is sustained the judges' decision shall be over-ruled and the Prizes shall be dealt with in such manner and awarded to such Exhibitors as the Executive committee may determine.
14. The decision of the Judges, subject to the provision of Rule 13 shall be final.
